# **Toronto Welcomes the DA General Service Board**

Celsius, Customs, toonies, and snowstorms didn't slow down the work of the DA Trustees as they met at the first-ever GSB face-toface business meeting on international soil.

**DAA** members of Toronto, Canada, welcomed the DA General Service Board of Trustees (GSB) to Toronto, the site of the GSB's Spring face-to-face (F2F) business meeting. The meeting took place the last weekend of February, 2007.

The eleven DA Trustees journeyed from points around the U.S. After working all day Friday, the Trustees boarded a van for a ride to a special DA meeting in downtown Toronto, organized by the Toronto Intergroup. After the meeting, many of the group walked to a nearby restaurant for dinner and fellowship. The Trustees worked all day Saturday and Sunday morning, and departed Sunday afternoon as a snowstorm came rolling up from the South.

The GSB chose Toronto for this year's Spring F2F site as the first step in an effort to reach out to the DA Fellowship in other countries. In recent years, the GSB Spring F2F meeting has been held in Hous-

ton, Needham, and Chicago.

The annual GSB Spring F2F is a chance for the Trustees to talk in depth and at length about issues facing DA as a whole. The Trustees spend a significant amount of time at each Spring F2F meeting conducting a GSB inventory. The 2007 inventory included questions such as, "How is the General Service Board fulfilling its purpose of serving the Fellowship of Debtors Anonymous?" Other projects included a midyear review of the 2006-2007 spending plan, a demonstration of the long-awaited DA Web site searchable meeting list function, and discussion of DA copyright issues, GSB committee structure, and GSB officer nominations. Each GSB committee also met to continue working on specific projects. See the GSB committee reports on page 3.

One very important job tackled by the GSB at the Spring F2F was the review of the 2007 DA World Service Conference (WSC) registration packet and spending plan, prepared and submitted by the 2007 WSC Boston Host Committee. The registration packet has been mailed to all registered groups. All groups are encouraged to re-list their group with the General Service Office to ensure that DA has accurate contact information. The 2007 WSC is scheduled for August 15-19, 2007, in the Boston area. (See the DA Web site events page for detailed information.)

Besides the Spring F2F meeting, the Trustees also meet in person at the annual World Service Conference. During the rest of the year, the Trustees conduct business via email and teleconference calls.

#### Ways & Means Committee

The Ways & Means Committee will be merging with the GSB's DA Focus Committee to form an expanded Communications Committee overseeing DA's print and online newsletters and some aspects of Web site content. The committee is considering a special issue to celebrate the 20th anniversary of the first DA World Service Conference.

#### InfoTech Committee

The Info Tech Committee demonstrated the next phase of DA's online searchable meeting list for the General Service Board at their February meeting. Work continues to move the database project forward. The Committee is also working on streamlining DA's email accounts and establishing a telephone information system for the General Service Office. In the near future, the Committee will begin to evaluate the DA web site for redesign, the first phase in developing a new user-friendly site.

#### **Public Information Committee**

The PI Committee has written to all Intergroups asking for information on local PI efforts and for input on how the GSB can help the Intergroups with their PI functions. The Committee has also produced and is in the process of mailing an anonymity letter to approximately 140 newspapers, radio and television networks, and magazines. The purpose of the letter is to inform the recipients of our public information and anonymity policies as outlined in Traditions 11 and 12. Finally, the Committee, with the help of our Media Contact, has approved a spreadsheet format

#### **Finance Committee**

The Finance Committee has the responsibility of managing DA's finances. See page 4 for the Treasurer's Report.

#### Office Committee

The Office Committee continues to work on upgrading and replacing equipment at the General Service Office, and making the office accessible for GSRs and ISRs coming to the World Service Conference in Massachusetts later this year.

#### **Nominations Committee**

The Nominations Committee continues to seek gualified candidates from the Northwest, Southwest, South, Midwest, and Northeast regions of the United States, and all parts of Canada to serve on the General Service Board as Class A debtor Trustees. GSRs who have attended at least one World Service Conference are especially encouraged to apply. For suggested qualifications and guidelines, please email the General Service Office.

#### The (Ad Hoc) Archives Committee

The ad hoc Archives Committee is planning a timeline of DA history for display at this year's World Service Conference in Sturbridge. Mass. Key dates in the fellowship's history will be displayed, along with copies of important historical materials. #### **Policy & Delegate Support** Committee (PDSC)

The Policy Committee is working on an expanded orientation session for GSRs and ISRs at the 2007 World Service Conference in Massachusetts. The committee hopes to develop a concentrated training for first-time GSRs and ISRs to help them be more effective in their service work within the framework of the DA Traditions and Concepts.

#### World Service Conference Support Committee (WSCSC)

The WSCSC invited the Host Committee chairs involved with the 2004, 2005, and 2006 World Service Conferences to be consultants on two conference calls. The purpose of the calls was to get feedback and ideas for improving the process of orchestrating future Conferences. The members also discussed the importance of creating a new Host Committee manual.

#### 2007 World Service Conference

The 2007 World Service Conference (WSC) is slated for August 15-19 in Sturbridge, Mass. The WSC registration packet is available now on the DA Web site. If your group's GSR did not receive a registration packet, please ensure your group's information is up-to-date with the General Service Office.

### World Service Conference Committee Reports

#### Fellowship Communications Committee (FCC)

The FCC serves as the advisory committee to the Wavs & Means, the free quarterly "meeting in print" of DA, available on the DA Web site.

#### Literature Committee

The Literature Committee has been holding monthly conference calls since the 2006 WSC in San Diego. We are in the process of reviewing a draft of a proposed new pamphlet received from Literature Services, as well as moving forward with the creation of a DA daily meditation/ reflection book. Also on our agenda is review of materials submitted by various groups and Intergroups for inclusion into the WSC literature approval process. We welcome and encourage all groups that have developed literature for local use to submit it to the Literature Committee for conference approval consideration, including Note: The Diversity Subcommittee will become a materials used in newcomer packets. [To submit materials, please contact the General Service Office for information.]

#### Internal Operations Committee

The Internal Operations Committee has formed a subcommittee to recommend literature for inclusion in a "new group" packet that would be sent to

newly registered DA groups. A similar packet was discontinued some years ago. The IOC is also finalizing wording on a motion requiring annual reregistration of DA groups, and is working in concert with other committees to advance the practice of group sponsorship.

#### **Public Information Committee**

Since the last DA Focus, the Public Information Committee of the WSC has continued to meet on a monthly basis. In the course of these meetings, and during the weeks between them, we have produced an article on service for the next issue of the Ways & Means, we have continued to discuss the work and direction of the Diversity Subcommittee, and we have made and implemented a decision to hold the phone meetings of the Carry the Message Network on a weekly basis instead of monthly as has been the schedule in the past.

## **GSR Qualifications**

he Debtors Anonymous World Service Conference (WSC) brings together representatives of DA's groups and intergroups each year to review the state of the fellowship and make decisions about its future direction.

The Conference is an exciting event, and an important one. It gives groups and intergroups throughout the world opportunities to be an integral part of DA's conscience, to participate in the fellowship's service structure, and to work in close cooperation with the General Service Office and General Service Board of Trustees. But along with those privileges comes responsibility-the responsibility of sending the best-qualified delegates to ensure spiritual decision making and good policies for DA's future.

DA's Ninth Concept for World Service states "Good leaders, together with appropriate measures for choosing them at all levels, are necessary." Nowhere is this more apparent that at the annual WSC.

Long experience has shown that the Conference functions better when the GSRs (General Service Representatives) elected

by groups and the ISRs (Intergroup Service Representatives) chosen by intergroups meet certain qualifications. Most important among those qualifications are to have at least one year of not having incurred any unsecured debt and a successful record of service at the group or intergroup level. It is also suggested that GSRs and ISRs be actively working the 12 Steps of DA, have had at least two Pressure Relief meetings, and be active in a home group. Furthermore, good GSRS and ISRs have personal qualities that prepare them for the oftenchallenging work of the Conference-the ability to work in harmony with others, even amid controversy, the stamina to stay focused for long hours during the busiest days of the WSC, and the willingness to follow the spiritual principles by which the Conference operates.

Those chosen as delegates should also be aware of the workload—all GSRs and ISRs are expected to work on a standing committee of the Conference for the full length of the WSC, and by telephone or email throughout the year until the next Conference. They also have the job of carrying the unified whole. ■

group conscience of their group or intergroup to the Conference, and of reporting news of the Conference's activities to their groups.

Delegates should be committed to following the spiritual principle of rotation practiced at all levels of the DA service structure. GSRs and ISRs, like Trustees and other trusted servants, rotate out of their positions after either one or two 3-year terms, and are expected to serve no more than 3 years on any one committee. Rotation ensures a regular flow of new ideas, and prevents the distraction and disruption caused by a particular individual or issue becoming "entrenched" year after year.

The selection of a GSR or ISR is a solemn trust for any DA service entity. Members should take the time to find the right person to represent them on the World Service level, and to not allow the selection to become a "personality contest." The strength of the DA service structure rests in the group conscience of the GSRs and ISRs who serve our Fellowship at the Conference. DA benefits from a strong and
