

Service Opportunity: Bring Hope to Debtors Around the World

The D.A. GSB Literature Translation and Licensing Committee (LTL) is seeking an [Appointed Committee Member \(ACM\)](#).

The trustees' Committee on Literature Translations and Licensing (LTL) has two principal areas of activity:

- Firstly it ensures a consistent translation and verification process for D.A. groups and Intergroups around the world working to translate D.A. literature into different languages.
- Secondly it oversees the licensing of D.A. copyrighted literature and service material, whether in print or other media. This is a new area of work for DA GSB.
- It also advises the GSB on the updating of policies regarding these two areas.

As an ACM you might have expertise in one or more aspects of the translation or licensing processes. Your role will help change the lives of suffering debtors around the world who are in need of our message of hope.

D.A. members interested in serving in this role should have

- Three years of not incurring unsecured debt
- Active engagement in the Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions
- Knowledge of D.A. literature
- Availability to participate in the LTL committee's monthly conference call for the length of service.
- Availability to support individual projects with in-depth independent effort

You may also have

- Knowledge of commonly used licensing concepts, practices, and procedures within the publishing business
- Legal writing skills, specifically the ability to draft publishing/licensing contracts that could then be overseen by our lawyer
- Translation experience

How to Apply

D.A. members interested in serving the D.A. Fellowship in this role must submit three documents:

1. Letter of Nomination from a person or D.A. group, stating their knowledge of the applicant's experience in a service role or activity. Any GSB trustee, GSR, ISR, board committee, conference committee, GSR group, Intergroup, D.A. group, or D.A. member may make the nomination.
2. Letter of Intent from the applicant stating: 1) their interest in serving on this committee, and 2) that they meet the ACM guidelines described in the D.A. Manual for Service.
3. Service Biography of the applicant showing prior D.A. service, other Twelve Step service, and other qualifications or service.
4. Professional Resume addressing specific skills sought by LTL.
